

Kursus med Laura Schumann - arbejde med hest fra jorden

Laura Schumann har sagt ja til at afholde kursus i Ebberup Rideklub bla. i hvordan man kan opnå bedre tillid og derved bedre samarbejde med sin hest via arbejde fra jorden. Laura vil udarbejde program efter hvilken deltager der er og hvad man gerne vil arbejde med på holdet. Ved at deltage i flere kursusforløb vil der være mulighed for at man kan fordybe sig noget mere og opnå bedre resultater.

Der er mulighed for at være 6 deltagende heste pr dag og det er også muligt at være tilskuer til kurset. Undervisningen er fra ca. kl. 10 – 16 incl. en frokostpause.

Næste kursusdag bliver i d. 03 marts 2012 og forventer en gang mere inden sommerferien.

Prisen for et kursusforløb med hest er 750 kr. pr. gang.

Da kursets formål blandt andet også er at øge sikkerheden i omgangen med heste, hvilket er et af fokusområderne for EBR, har bestyrelsen i Ebberup rideklub besluttet at yde et økonomisk tilskud til dette kursus.

Dette betyder at for medlemmer af Ebberup rideklub koster det KUN 500 kr. pr. gang at deltage med hest.

Her hvad hun fortæller om sig selv og deres træningsfilosofi på hjemmesiden:

Laura Schumann Torres, 6th generation of one of the most renowned circus families of Denmark. The Schumann family were some of the best horse trainers of all times and producers of one of the most successful circuses in Denmark until 1982. Growing up Laura was always surrounded by horses and learned from her father and grandfather, Philip and Max the family traditions of horse training. Part of becoming an proper circus artist in this family meant to master other skills besides training horses, so she attended ballet, dancing lessons and piano for the most part of her childhood.

At the age of 19 she traveled to the United States looking for better ways to train her horses. She joined her aunt Katja Schumann at the Big Apple Circus in New York City. Laura worked as the head groom of the stable and assisted Katja and her grandfather Max in the daily training of the horses. Eventually she became part of the cast and performed in the show with the family.

After returning from the states she continued her education and is now working as a very successful physiotherapist. In her training of horses she is using the long traditions of horse training

that runs in the family, her knowledge as a physiotherapist and combining it with new concepts, which give a touch of Real Mastery to her training.

“Working with horses in liberty like my family use to do, Riding completely bit less and working the collection of the horse in total freedom is the way I work now, but I also know that there is a potential of Mastery in everything, and so I help anyone who wants to learn how to work better with horses.”

We practice The Classical Dressage completely bit less or bridle less, we also work on our riding skills without the use of the saddle. Our goal is to achieve the highest level of horse training and riding using the simplest and most efficient techniques, we don't like to complicate our work with over analysis, over thinking or ideas. We like to follow a more intuitive path than the rest of the world.

We follow the appropriate steps of progress, which emphasises the importance of the ground work as the foundation to good training (unfortunately this step is mostly skip by the new generation of horse trainers, that consider it as a waste of time due to their ignorance). Most important for us is the correct posture, bending and position of the horses head and body, avoiding the most common mistake when riding in liberty.

We are not part of societies, clubs, associations etc... and we do not convert people that practices with us in to any believe. We only help them to become better and to find their own path.

We do not have or follow a system, method or program of training. These things are made for machines not for horses and people. Our way of practice is much simpler.
